



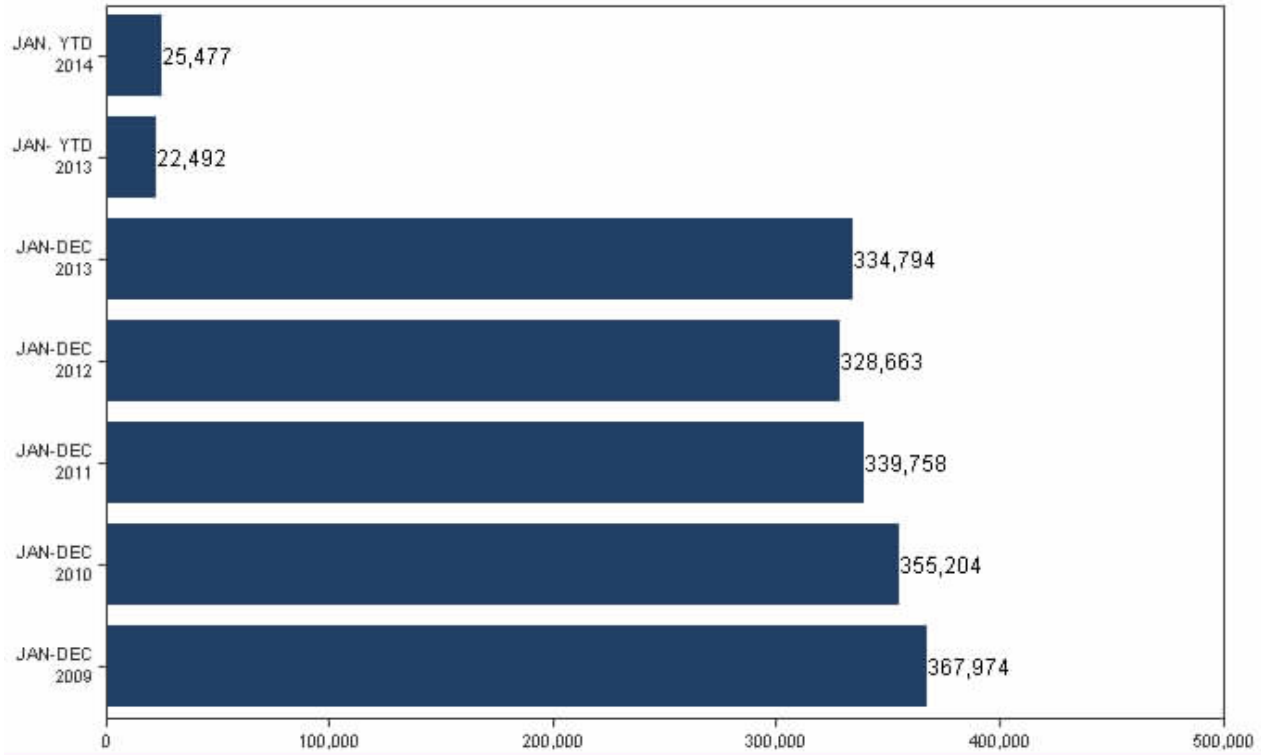

## Enplanements/Corpus Christi International Airport



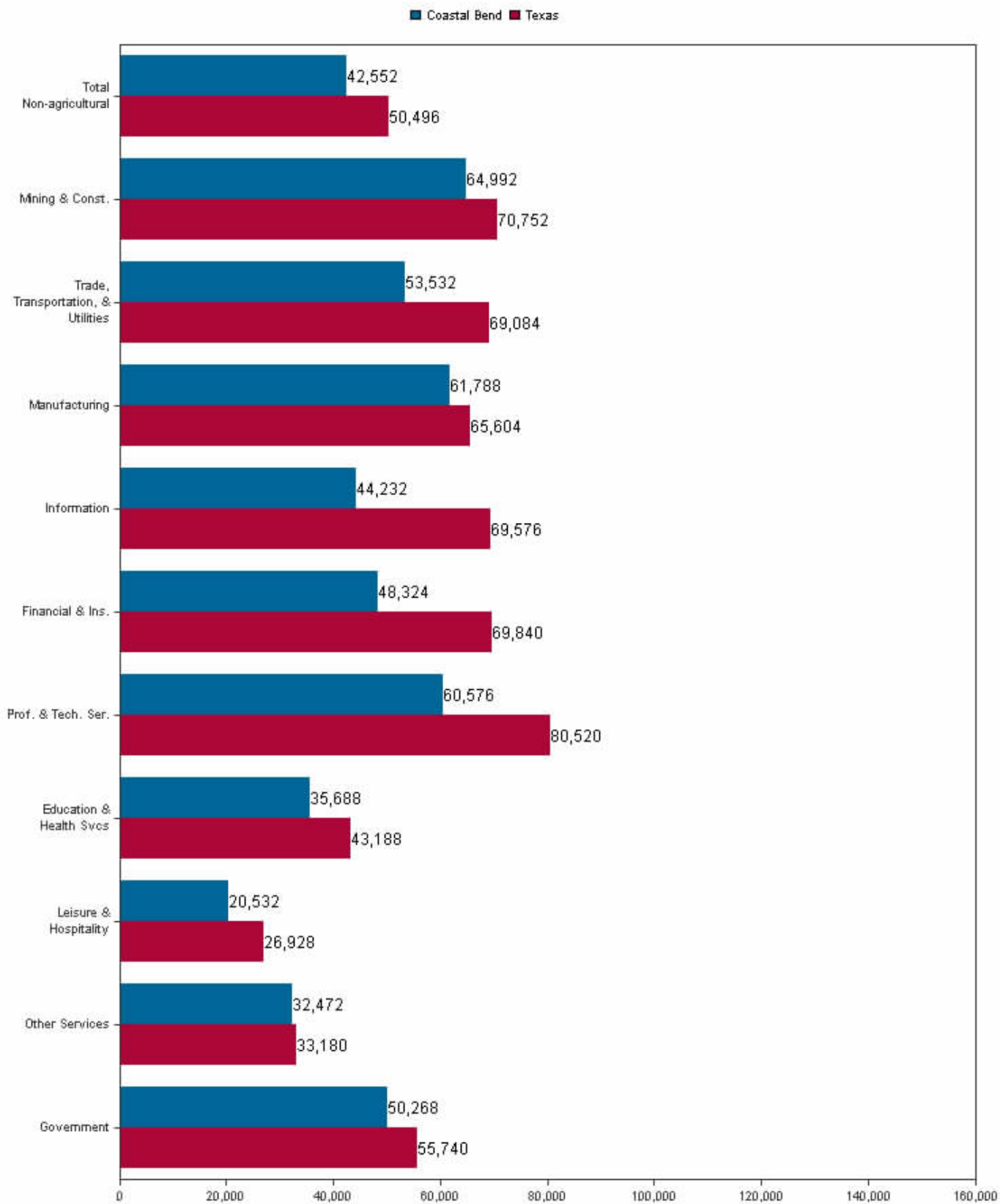

# Average Annual Wages 3rd Quarter 2013



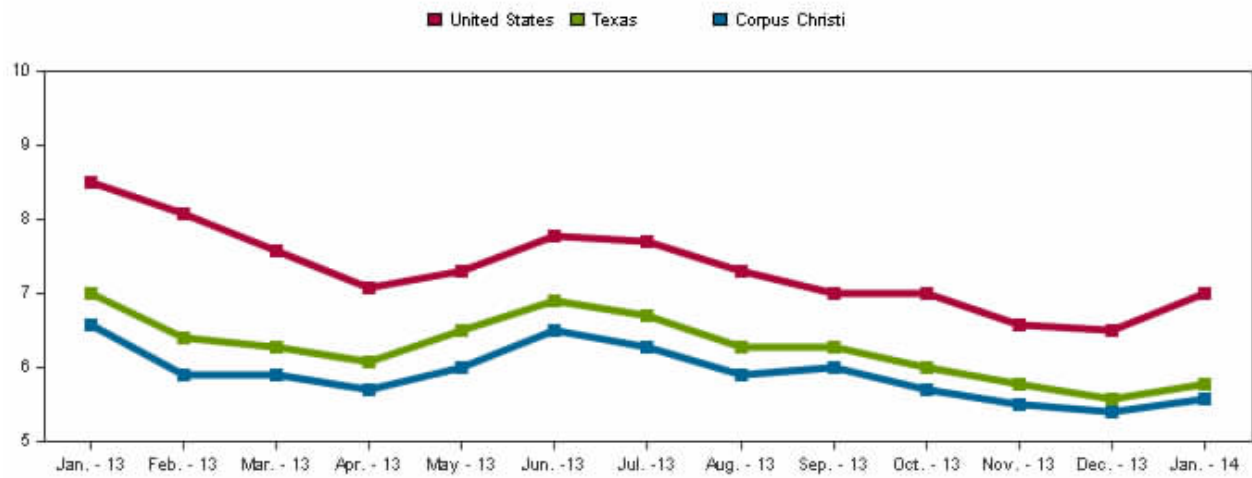
