



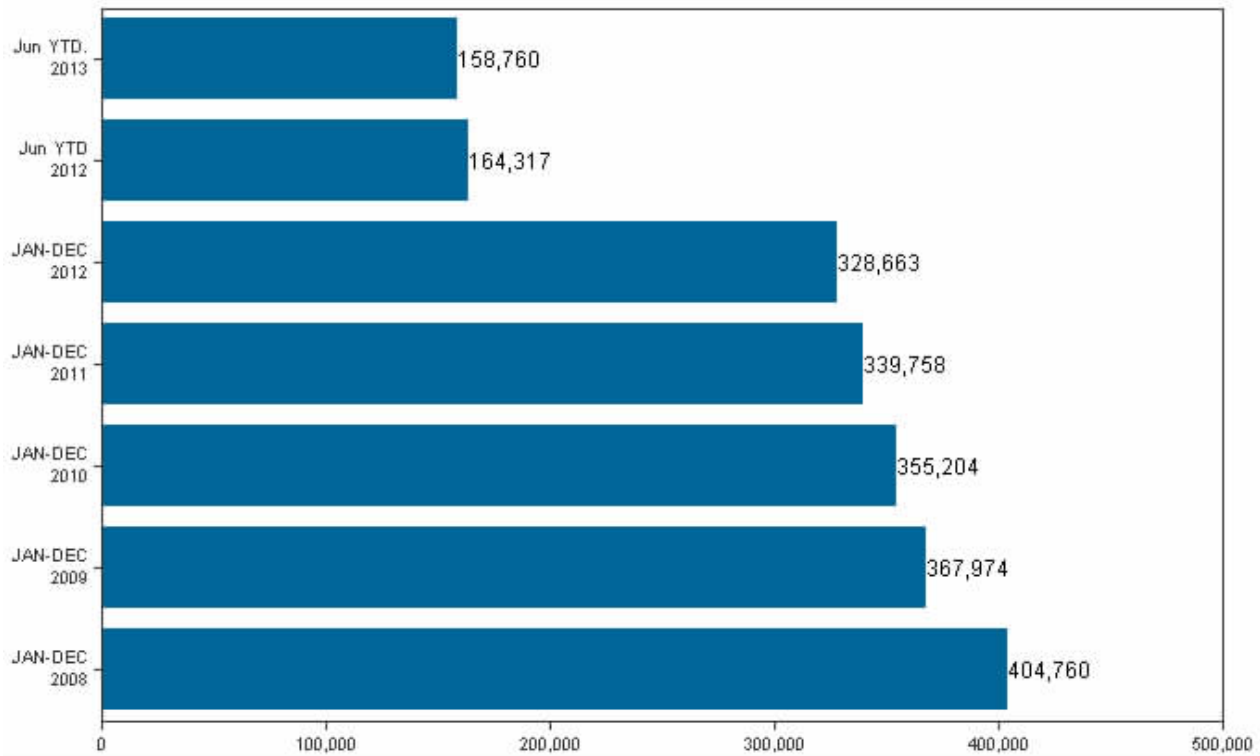

## Enplanements/Corpus Christi International Airport

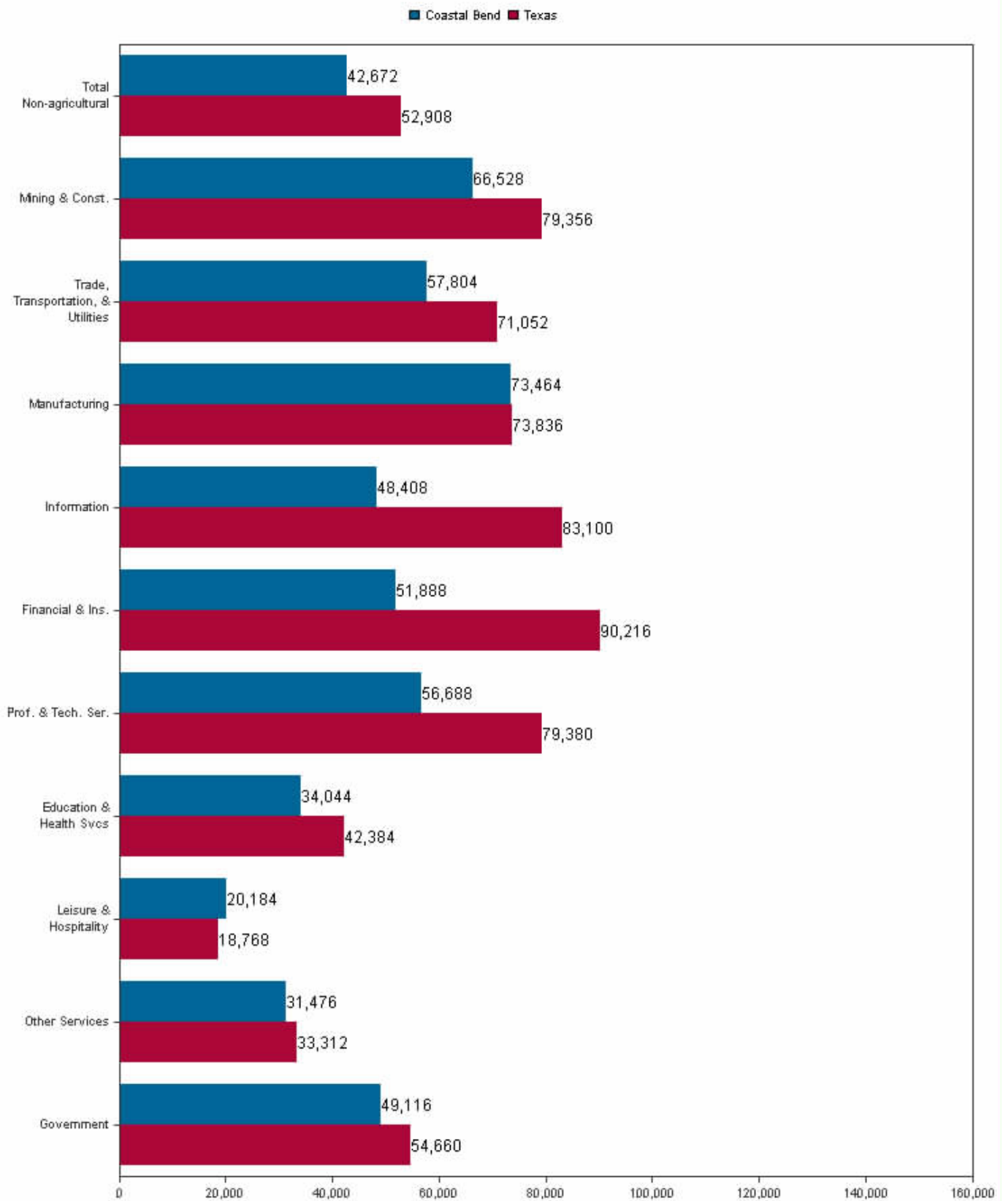

# Average Annual Wages 1st Quarter 2013

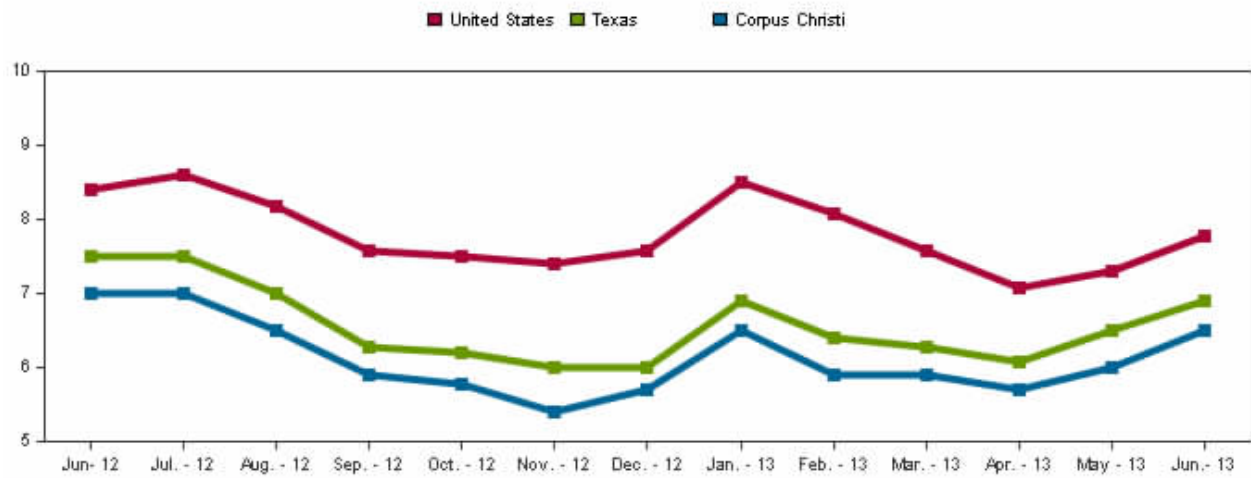
