



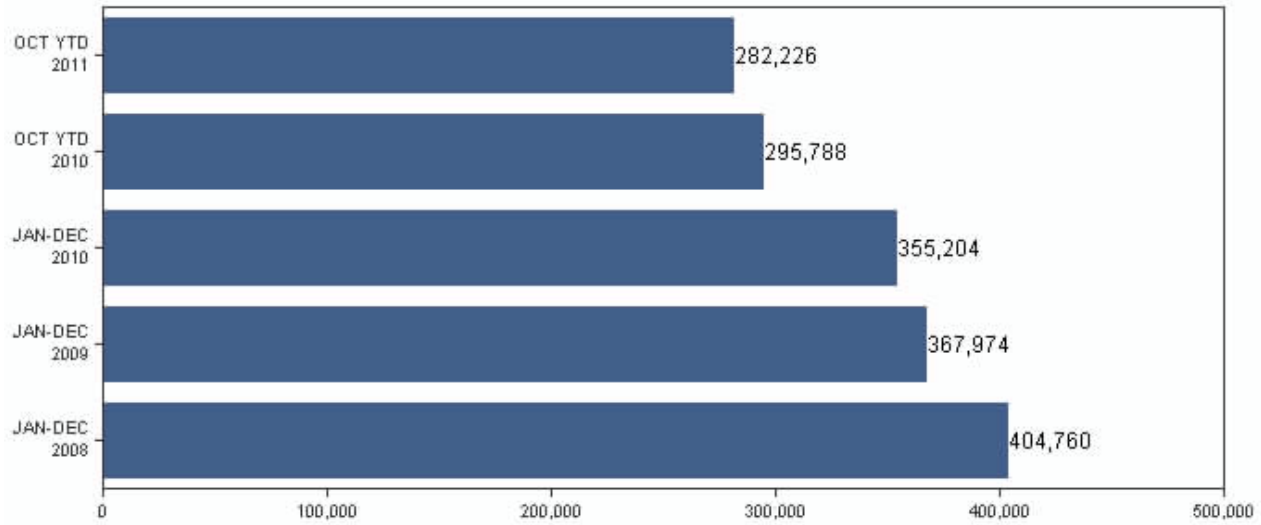

## Enplanements/Corpus Christi International Airport

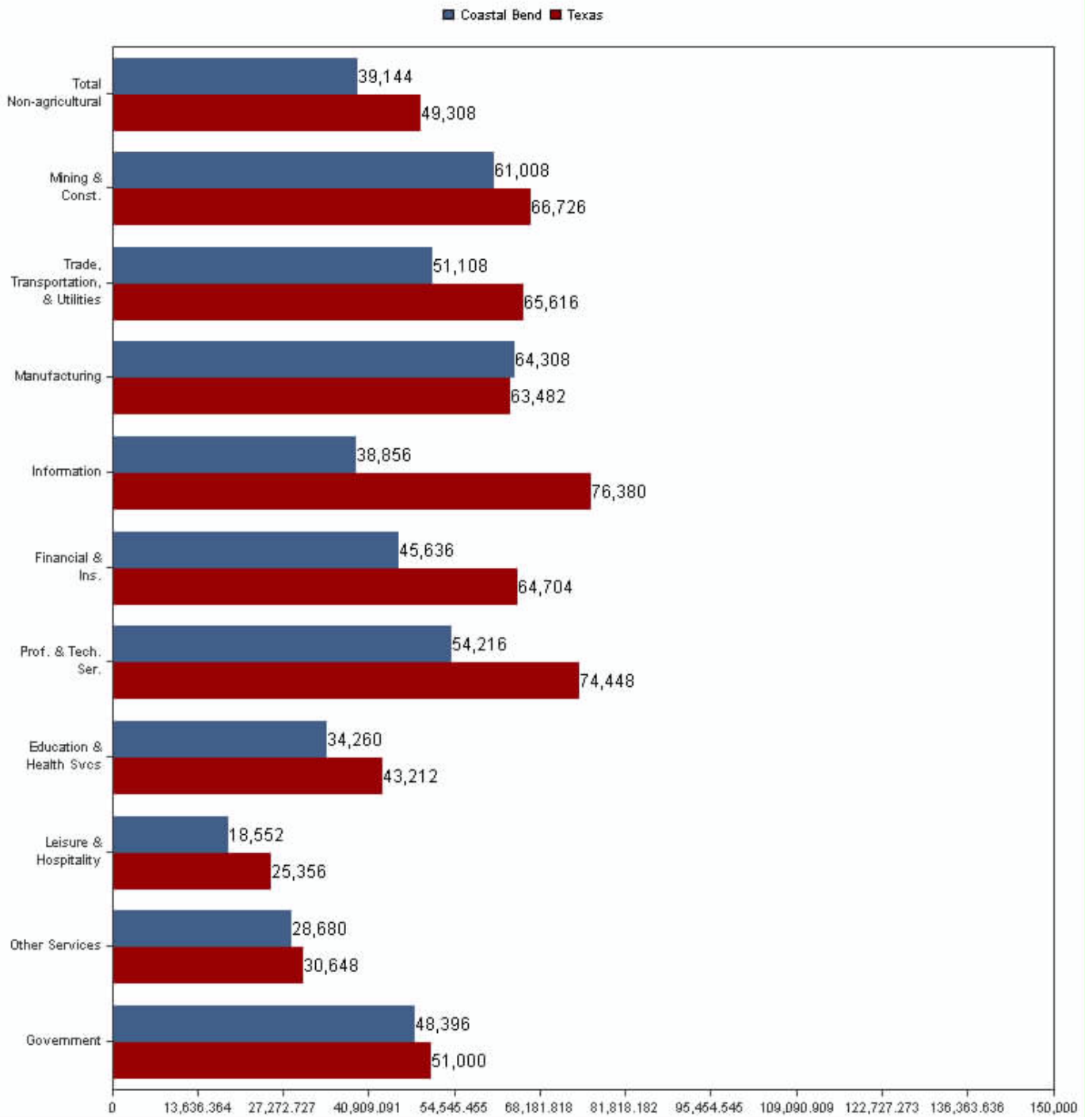

## Average Annual Wages 1st Quarter 2011

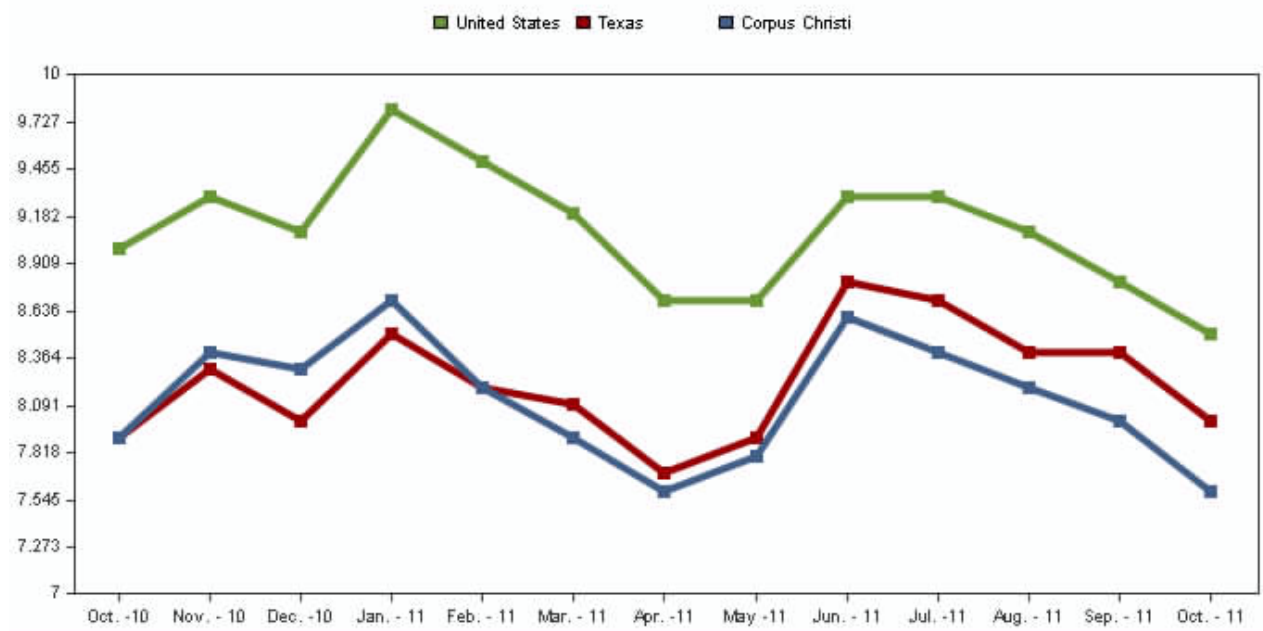
