



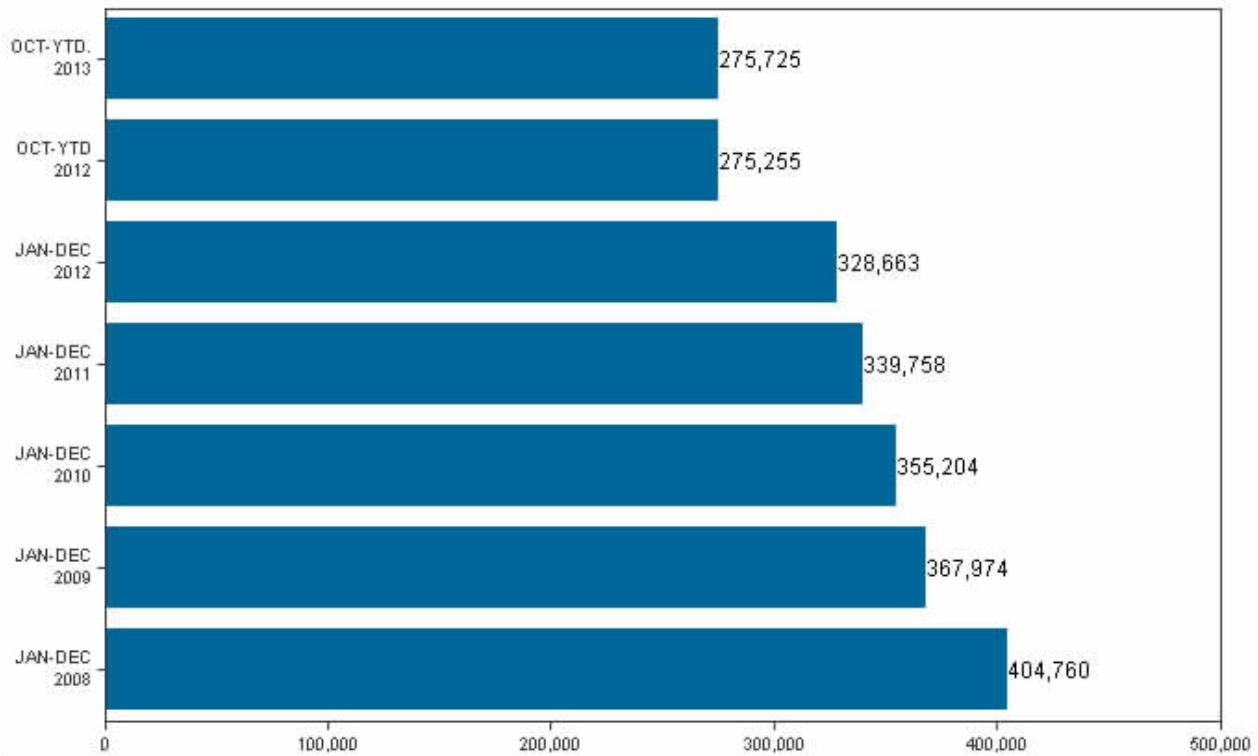

## Enplanements/Corpus Christi International Airport

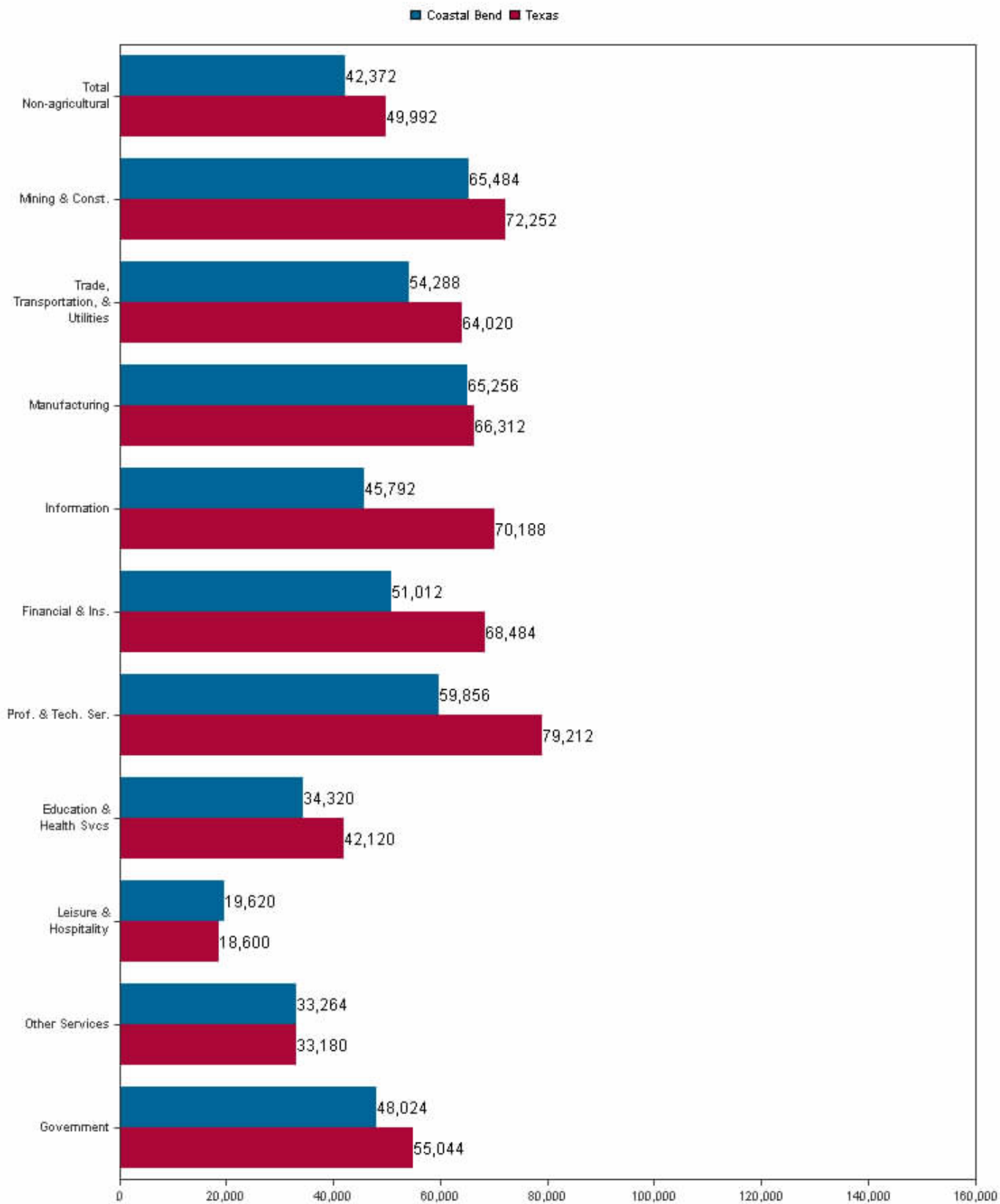

Average Annual Wages 2nd Quarter 2013

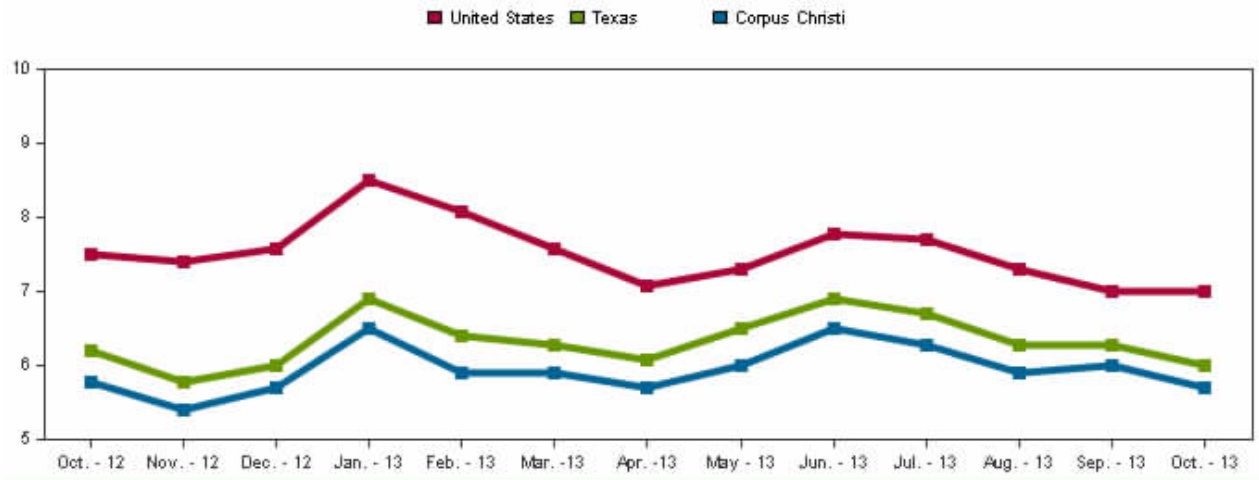
