



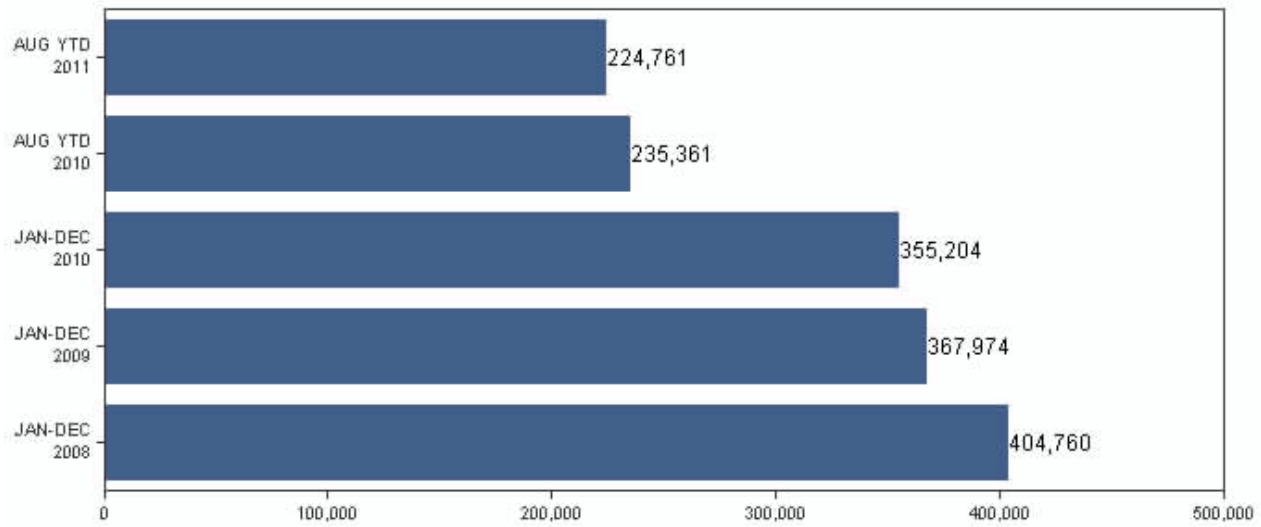

## Enplanements/Corpus Christi International Airport

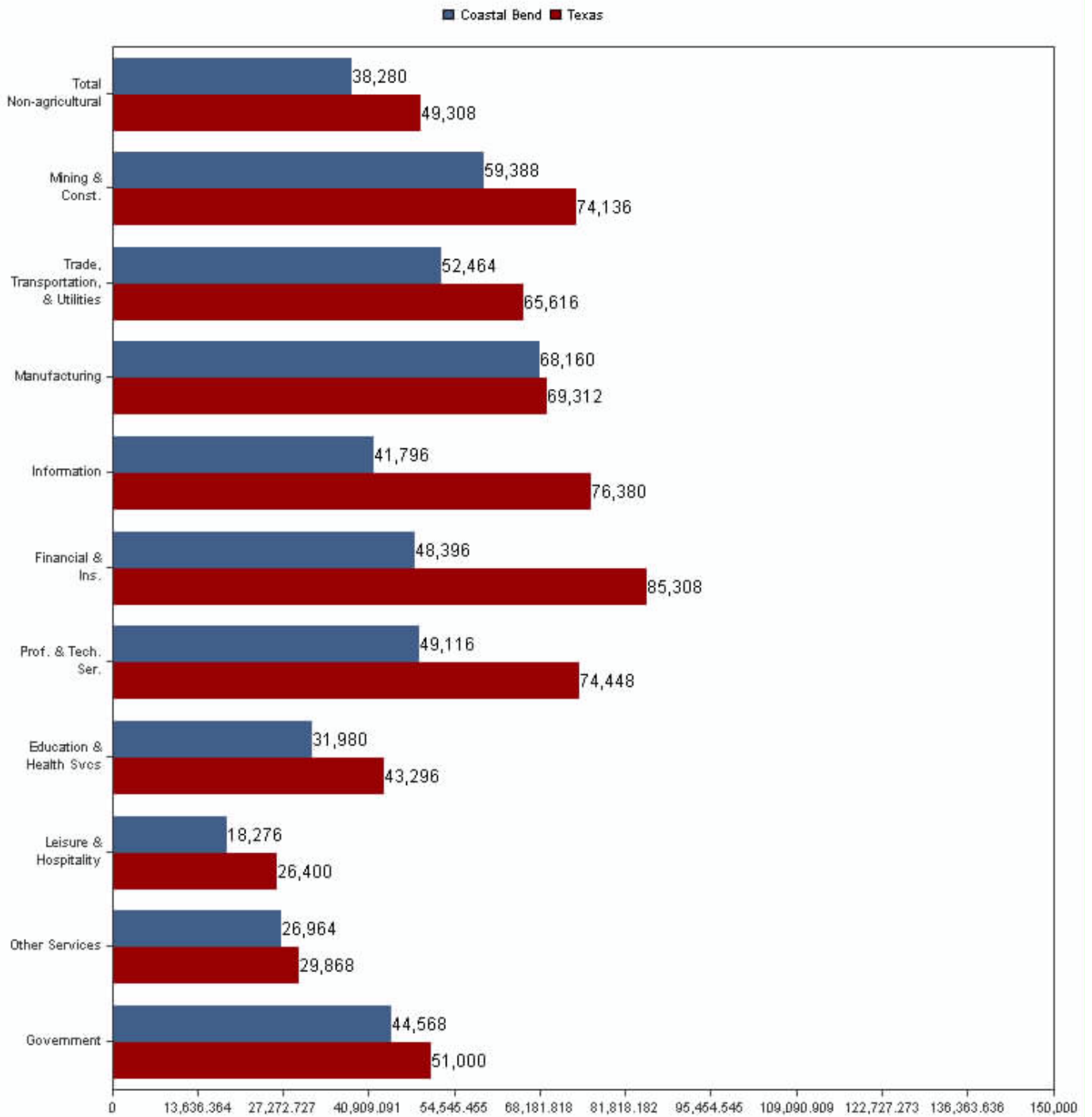

**Average Annual Wages 1st Quarter 2011**

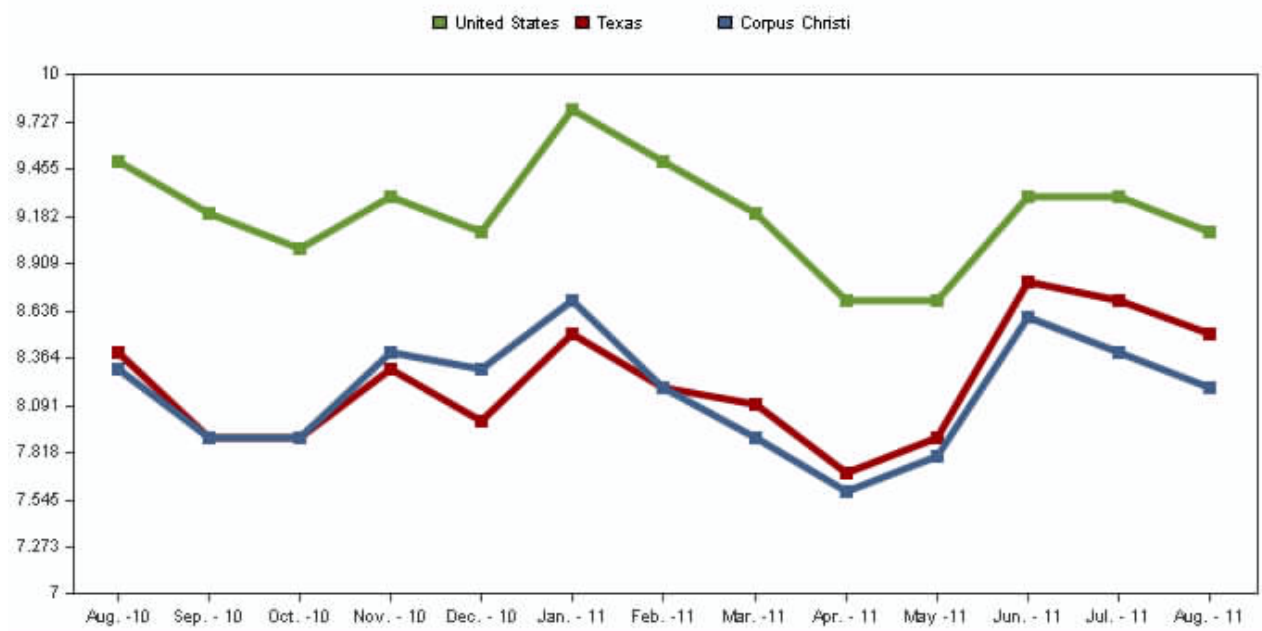
